For this assignment implementation, F2F/AET program Guinea is seeking an expert with 10 years of experience in gender inclusion in all steps of agricultural project design, implementation, and follow up. The potential volunteer must have knowledge, skill and tools for gender inclusion in agricultural project process (design, planning, implementation, management and follow up). Strong knowledge in West African culture and specifically Guinean will be a great asset.

As Guinea is French speaking country, fluency in French writing and speaking will be helpful. However, the Winrock office will provide a translator to ease communication between the volunteer and the hosts and partner.

#### **Duration and Dates of Assignment (including travel):**

This assignment requires three weeks including four (4) days of International travel from/to USA, one (1) day for the volunteer's briefing in WI Guinea Office, one (1) day for travel to Kindia, one (1) day for Introduction to USAID Guinea, ten (10) days of training workshop/field work with the hosts, and two (2) days for End of Assignment report writing.

This assignment implementation is suggested for the months of April or May 2015.

#### **Executive Summary:**

Winrock International is seeking an experienced volunteer to provide Training of Trainers in gender mainstreaming in the agricultural sector for two local NGOs (SARA and RGTA-DI) in Kindia region in Guinea.

These two NGOs are supporting farmer's organizations (individual farmers, farmer's groups, unions and federations) in three regions in Guinea (lower Guinea, central Guinea and Upper Guinea) to improve their organizational capacity and increase their productions and marketing. Most often, the two NGOs hire graduated youth from AET institutions (ENAE and ISAV), yet these graduates are poorly skilled in agricultural enterprise development and management, and thus, many farmers' organizations are underdeveloped and are struggling to make a profitable business. Furthermore, there are not enough women within NGO field staff and agricultural enterprises. Many efforts have been made towards women's inclusion, but gender mainstreaming still remains to be improved. For these reasons, the two local NGOs are committed to strongly consider gender inclusion in all activities for gender equity and sustainability.

## **Background and host 1 Organization Profile: SARA**

Farmers Supporting Network (SARA) is a Non Government Organization (NGO) created in December 9<sup>th</sup> 1998, by decision No A / 2000 / 749 / MATD /CAB /SACCO. It has 63 members (including 43 women). This NGO is governed by an Executive Board of 11 members (9 women), the number of employees is 22 (4 women). The current partners of SARA are: TRIAS, UNDP, European Union, African Bank of Development (BAD), FAO, DVV International, AFD, NEPAD and FIDA. SARA works also with private farmers, groups of producers, union and federations in Lower guinea (Dubreka, Coyah; Forecariah, Kindia, Boffa, Fria, Télimélé and Boké) and Central Guinea (Dalaba and Pita).

SARA is a local NGO specifically dedicated to support women farmer organizations to increase their income, level of literacy and decision making, while contributing in food security achievement. The main objectives of SARA is building capacity of women family farms to increase their productions and improve access to markets. In addition SARA is making much effort in women alphabetization, decision making and motivate women in agricultural enterprises development. The main sub sectors targeted by SARA supported organization are; rice, horticulture, peanut and palm oil.

SARA field staff benefited from several training sessions; among others we can list: enterprise management, rural communication techniques and monitoring and evaluation....etc.

## **Background and Host2 Organization Profile:** RGTA-DI

The Guinean Network for Animal Traction – Integrated Development (**RGTA-DI**) is a Non Government Organization (NGO) created in December 11<sup>th</sup> 1991, by decision No 14 / 0588 /MIS /DND /SCID of January 31, 1995. It has 70 members (including 29 women). NGO is governed by an Executive Board of

9 members (women), the number of employees is 39 (6 women). RGTA is supporting 73 farmers groups (including 48 women groups) The RGTA is collaborating with following partners: TRIAS, FBS (Belgium), European Union, African Bank of Development (BAD), FAO and Guinean Government. RGTA-DI works also with private farmers, group of producers, union and federations in Lower Guinea (Dubreka, Coyah, Forecariah, Kindia, Boffa and Boké) Upper Guinea (Dabola and Dinguiraye) and Central Guinea (Dalaba).

The objectives of the RGTA are building capacity of farmers organizations to insure food security, income generation through the promotion of animal traction and environment protection. In addition to that , RGTA -DI is organizing producers and train them for sustainability. The main sub sectors targeted by RGTA-DI activities are; rice, horticulture, peanut and integration agriculture and livestock.

RGTA field staff benefited from several training sessions; among others we can list: data collection, Human Resource Management, crops production technique, integrated land management, report writing technique...etc.

## **Objectives of the Assignment:**

The main objectives of this assignment are:

- 1) To assess the SARA and RGTA-DI NGOs field staff level in term of gender mainstreaming.
- 2) Support to identify the main constraints in gender inclusion affecting implementation of rural activities.
- 3) Provide Training of Trainer's sessions in gender mainstreaming, particularly to promote economic development.
- 4) Provide SARA and RGTA-DI field staff with appropriate tools and skills to identify opportunities and strategies for gender inclusion. The volunteer will also provide the field staff with appropriate management tools (guide).

#### Tasks to be performed:

To achieve the above-stated objectives, the following activities will be undertaken:

- 1) Assess current situation of SARA and RGATA-DI about gender inclusion in activities;
- 2) Develop and deliver training package on gender mainstreaming in farm activities;
- 3) Provide appropriate management tools and skills for gender inclusion in all activities (identification of opportunities, project designing, implementation and follow up);
- 4) Provide relevant recommendations and suggestions based on discussions and training.
- 5) Provide training tools (guide) about gender mainstreaming for NGO field staff.

#### **Working/living Conditions and Materials Needed for Assignment:**

The assignment will be implemented in Guinea. (Please See Country profile attached for more information). This assignment will be implemented at Kindia. All the materials needed for the training sessions will be provided by host and Winrock field office.

**A.** In Conakry: Upon arrival and at the time of departure from Guinea, the volunteer will stay at a Golden Plazza Hotel (bed and breakfast) in Conakry:

Internet is available by WIFI the project team will also provide a modem for access to internet. Ozone treated safe drinking water is available throughout the country. Electricity is supplied at 220-240 volts. The average

- temperature in May of Conakry will be hot and sometime raining, approximately 32° C (89.6° F). At Kindia the nights are very cool.

The hotel has a air-conditioned rooms; equipped with TV set, wifi connexion, treated mosquito net. The quality of services is quiet good. The hotel could also propose and organize a touristic tour and picnic at the following sites:

- Escalade of Gangan Mountain,
- Swimming at Kilissi water fall and "voile de la mariée",
- Small boat tour on Samaya lake,
- Shopping at the Federation of Artisan of Kindia and at the enterprise "Kanya Néma" of women processor of fruit and horticulture product.
- **C.** Personal carry-on should include insect repellent. Medical help will be generally available. A converter to use 220 volt 50 Hz electricity and adapter plug for two/three round pin system will be useful. Although reasonably good medical facilities are available locally, the volunteer expert is recommended to bring essential medicine.

As a precautionary measure, eat only thoroughly cooked food or fruits and vegetables; don't eat food purchased from street vendors. Remember: boil it, cook it, peel it, or forget it; Moreover, if you have any specific dietary concerns (Vegetarian, Vegan or Diabetic) please let the field staff know in advance then necessary and appropriate arrangement will be made in time.

In Guinea, many road are currently under construction and traffic jam is very common, be careful and don't accept to travel at night.
